Father Simon Our Assistant Area Dean writes:



And so the end of our Lenten journey is in sight, with Holy Week and Easter drawing ever closer.

Each year, I always find it interesting to note which day occupies

my mind most - Good Friday or Easter Day. It seems like a gauge of my attitude to life at that particular moment.

Will the Good Friday accounts of Jesus' sacrifice and suffering hit home more to me this year, particularly with the wars and conflict of the past few years still in our thoughts and prayers, along with the hardship and illness that many have to endure? Or will the joy and celebration of Jesus' resurrection engage my heart and mind more as we remember the eternal new life God offers to each one of us, and the joy that that reassurance can bring to Christians?

But then there's the additional - often overlooked - dimension of the Easter story which sometimes catches me unawares. With the joy and celebration comes the fear and shock and bewilderment of the



resurrection that was part of the Easter story for Jesus' disciples as they came to terms with what, in today's

phraseology, might be described as a paradigm shift.

For me, that reminder of the fear and struggle that can be associated with new starts is a helpful image. I've called more than ten towns or cities 'home' over the years. Each move has been prayed about and chosen, and has held the promise of good things to come. But each move has also held sadness and struggle.

In the end, it was always the right thing to do and brought joy and growth, but that doesn't mean

that it was always easy. It's no doubt a fear and struggle that many Ukrainians experienced on a much greater level

when their war with Russia began and they became refugees. Even though a move to the likes of the UK meant they were now



safer from the Russian invasion of their homeland, it didn't make the fear and struggle any easier.

And new starts - be they, for example, of work or relationships or in the wake



of an unwelcome diagnosis - are rarely always easy. Whether chosen or forced upon us, new starts can be hard - particularly if we don't know

whether we've made the right decision or what the future might hold. These new opportunities can challenge, confuse, and scare us. And so it's in those situations that the Easter story can bring hope as we see the victory, new life, and freedom that came as a result of Jesus' death and resurrection to new life beyond the initial fear and shock and bewilderment.

So, as we celebrate Easter this year, I pray that you can celebrate the hope that God is offering each one of us, know the joy that God is giving, and, whether it's difficult or not, you're able to grasp the gift of new life that God offers each one of us.

May God bless you this Holy Tr Simon Week and Eastertide,



The Government's commitment to digital technology in the new 10-year NHS Plan is becoming increasingly prominent. A key part of this initiative is the NHS App, and I highly recommend signing up if you haven't already.

The app provides easy access to your medical records, blood test results and investigations, along with a convenient way to order medications. It also includes health and wellbeing resources to help you manage your care more effectively. Having the app on your phone ensures this information is always at your fingertips—especially useful in emergencies or while travelling.

If you're hesitant about installing it on your device, a digital inclusion session is held every Wednesday from 2:00 to 3:30pm at Little Hadham Village Hall. Members of our patient group will be there to help you get set up and answer any questions.

The previous edition, along with the next two job articles, have been written by members of staff who visit and support the practice as part of the 'additional roles' initiative.

"I'm Jacqueline, a Pharmacy Technician with the Stort Valley & Villages Primary Care Network. My career began at Lloyds Pharmacy in Hertford—though, at first, it wasn't meant to be a career at all! I simply wanted a job to fund my love of clothes and makeup. But I quickly fell in love with the work, completed my Pharmacy Technician qualifications, managed multiple branches, and ended up staying with Lloyds for 15 years.

In September 2023, I joined the PCN and haven't looked back. I now work three days a week at Church Street Surgery in Bishop's Stortford and spend Wednesdays at Much Hadham Health Centre. My role involves conducting audits, ensuring prescribing aligns with local and national guidelines, monitoring medication and condition requirements, and supporting our pharmacist, Dilusha. (Pretty please get your blood tests done—it really helps me out!)

Give your lawn a boost now

Find out how to give your lawn a spring boost, ready for the wear and tear of summer. Take these simple steps in spring, and look forward to a vibrant, healthy lawn this summer...

To do: March/April/May

The first time you mow the lawn each year, it should be done with the mower blades set high to help thicken the grass. Afterwards, focus on weeding to reduce competition for nutrients and moisture.

You Will Need

- Garden fork or hollow-tine aerator
- · Sharp/silver sand,
- Half-moon iron or spade
- Wire-tooth rake or powered scarifier



Step 1

Aerate to prevent waterlogging. This is particularly important if your lawn has endured heavy rains over winter. If yours is still squelchy, spike it with a garden fork every 15cm. You could also buy or hire a hollow-tined aerator that will remove cores of soil. You can sweep sharp/silver sand into the holes to help the ground dry out and help prevent future water logging.

Step 2

Recut edges using a half-moon iron or spade. You can do this by eye, but you'll get a better result by following the line of a scaffolding plank or other sturdy plank of wood, some taut twine or a snaking hosepipe if you want smooth curves.

Step 3

Use a spring-tined rake to rake moss from lawns to encourage grass to grow more vigorously.

Creating lawn patch fillers

When reshaping the lawn, collect up the strips and place them 5cm apart in a compost-filled seed tray, then grow on outside or in a cold frame. To replace the bare patch, cut out a square or rectangle around the area and, using a hand trowel, dig up the soil in the rectangle to whatever depth of soil your new turf strip is. Gently lay the turf, cut to fit, over the patch. Firm it down so that there are no gaps and your new turf is no higher or lower than your existing lawn.

St Cecilia's Church Bells

Quasi

It is thought that bells were first created over 3,000 years ago and that even from their early origins they have been associated with religion and religious services.

Church bell facts;-

Metal bells were first made in ancient China. The tradition of using bells was passed on through to Hindu and Buddhist religions. Bells were installed at the entrances to Hindu temples and rung for prayer.

Paulinus, Bishop of Nola and Campania introduced bells to Christian churches. Though the ringing of bells is not mentioned in the Bible, it does encourage worshippers to 'make a joyful noise'. Bells were introduced into Christian churches around 400 AD by Paulinus after missionaries had been using handbells to call people to worship. It would take a further 200 years for bells to be featured prominently in churches and monasteries across Europe. In 604 Pope Sabinian sanctioned the use of church bells during worship. By 750 the Archbishop of York and the Bishop of London introduced rules for the ringing of the church bells.

It was believed church bells held supernatural powers in the Middle Ages. It was believed that church bells could ring themselves, particularly at times of tragedy and disaster. One story being, when Thomas Becket was murdered, the bells of Canterbury Cathedral rang themselves. In the 18th century bells were rung to drive away evil, heal the sick, protect the

souls of the dead, calm storms before journeys and mark days of execution.

Medieval bells were made from sheets of iron which was bent into shape, then dipped in copper.

People were paid to ring and maintain the bells and this often equated to a substantial amount of the church's outgoings. The ringers in a Westminster church were paid 1 shilling to ring to mark the execution of Mary, Queen of Scots.

Late 19th-century Ordnance Survey maps record the location of numerous ponds in farmland across lowland England, but since then farming practices have changed and many have disappeared.

Well-maintained ponds are hot spots for biodiversity, supporting special plants and animals. Responding to concerns about the loss of such habitats, researchers at the Pond Restoration Research Group at University College London joined forces with others to investigate the potential for restoring such lost ponds and produced advice about the best ways to create new ones.

Following on from this, Essex Wildlife Trust identified 17,200 Essex farmland ponds on these old maps but noted that 10,400 had since disappeared. A few have been restored, and the team is working with the Farming & Wildlife Advisory Group to secure funding to help more farmers reinstate their lost ponds

However, pond restoration can be challenging - as evidenced by the difficulties faced during the project to resolve problems with Doctor's Pond in Great Dunmow. In recent years it has been polluted by toxic blue green algal growth. Ambitious and costly plans were drawn up to desilt the pond which necessitated the safe removal of fish so they could be returned in due course. Work commenced last October with the installation of safety fencing and



the draining

of water so that a digger could be used to help remove over 1,900 tons of contaminated silt. Heavy rains made the silt very slippery, and the digger became stranded in January. By the end of February all the silt had been removed.

Future plans include landscaping of the surrounding area and replanting with suitable vegetation once the pond is refilled. It is anticipated that in the coming months this attractive pond will once again provide a great habitat for ducks, fish and dragonflies.












