Jesus said, 'I am the good shepherd ... I came so that everyone would have life, and have it fully.' (John 10:10)





Little Hadham Parish Council meets the first Tuesday of each month in the Village Hall. There is no meeting in August or January. All residents and press are welcome to attend the meetings.

Sign of the Times

Cllr Williams provided an update. The request for the licence to be reviewed was put in on the 28th of May. The event holder voluntarily surrendered the licence on the 16th of May, which made the official Council review redundant. It was feasible for the licence to be transferred within the 30-day window, which would take us to the 14th of June. No such application was made, so the licence no longer exists. If anyone wants to hold any kind of event replicating what Sign of the Times would have been, will have to apply for a new licence from scratch.

Ongoing Parish Council Projects

- River Ash Monitoring an update from Cllr Westlake. Waiting for the co-ordinator to contact us, but at this time he is too busy to help, but we have 3 people who have experience in monitoring the river and the next stage will be to set up a meeting. The school is also keen to get involved with the monitoring.
- Ridgeway Project to turn an unused play area into a community area that will cater for all our residents and create an inclusive space – update clerk. Going to run this as a longer-term project.
- Bus Shelter Project The school are going to create art works for installation in each shelter as an ongoing project. The children will choose and create the artworks, perhaps: poppies for Remembrance Sunday; Christmas themed art etc. Shelters are on order; plans are drawn up.

Book Exchange - Telephone boxes – A resident has offered to look after the one in the Ford. Any maintenance works to be carried out before the Autumn. Do we still want the book exchange. If they aren't being used, we could remove the books and transfer the maintenance costs to another project in the village.

Down at the Doctors

Recent developments have brought some important updates regarding Tirzepatide (Mounjaro), a weight loss medication now approved for use in primary care by NHS England and NICE, as well as changes to the cervical screening programme.

Tirzepatide: Limited Access Started June 2025

From June 23, 2025, Tirzepatide also known as Mounjaro®—will be available through primary care. However, its initial availability will be limited to a very small group of patients due to strict eligibility criteria set by NHS England. This cautious approach ensures the medicine is introduced safely into the NHS without breaking the bank.

To be eligible, patients must have a Body Mass Index (BMI) of 40 or more, and at least four of the following diagnosed conditions:

- Hypertension
- Dyslipidaemia
- · Obstructive sleep apnoea
- Atherosclerotic Cardiovascular Disease (ASCVD)
- Type 2 diabetes mellitus

A search of our patient records found no individuals meeting these criteria at present, so please only contact us if you believe you qualify.

Cervical Screening: Longer Intervals for Low-Risk Individuals

NHS England has also updated the cervical screening programme. For those without a recent high-risk HPV positive result, the screening interval will change from every three years to every five years. This adjustment brings England in line with Scotland and Wales and reflects advances in understanding HPV's role in cervical cancer.

Since the UK introduced cervical screening in 1964, knowledge and tools have improved dramatically. HPV is now known to cause almost all cervical cancers, and vaccination against high-risk HPV strains is routinely offered to boys and girls aged 12-13. The new screening approach is more personalized: if you have no recent HPV findings, you'll be invited every five years; if you have or recently had high-risk HPV, screening will continue more frequently.

Furthermore as part of the new 10 Year Health Plan home kits will be offered to those that have missed their invite or haven't come forward making care more convenient and supporting the shift from treatment to prevention.

(I've already had a go at making raspberry jam (class 63) and it seemed to taste ok - next will be nectarine iam (class 62) and a practice at making a Swiss Roll (class 70). Why not have a go.

Guide to Summer Watering

Summer can be a tough time for plants. During very hot spells, greenhouses can become more like a desert while containers seem to dry out within hours of watering them. By knowing which plants to prioritise and when to water, you can make the best use of your time by watering those that need it most.

- Water every day or two the top 1. priorities for watering are seedlings, cuttings and young plants plus anything recently planted. Other thirsty plants are those potted in a greenhouse, such as tomatoes and cucumbers. Water the trunks of tree ferns daily to create humidity.
- 2. Water once a week next come plants with shallow root systems, including bedding plants and large, thin leaved subtropical plants and ferns. Big plants, moisture loving perennials and many veg crops, like spinach, lettuce and celerv will also suffer if left to dry out.
- 3. Water once a fortnight - during long dry spells, water plants that can normally fend for themselves. like clematis and roses by soaking thoroughly once a fortnight. Also water fruit trees on dwarfing rootstocks, shallow rooted shrubs like camellias and plantings from last Autumn in this way.
- 4. Avoid watering - parts of the garden can be left unwatered to reduce dependence on irrigation and allow tough plants like verbascums to thrive. Don't water mature trees. shrubs and hedges - it's a waste. Lawns may also be left unwatered if it goes brown, it will recover when rain arrives.

Some drought resistant plants:- Alliums, Ballota, Euphorbia, Gaura, Helianthemum, Nepeta, Santolina, Sedum, Stachys, Stipa, Thyme and Verbena,

On Friday 15th August all local ringers are coming together to ring to celebrate VJ Day. This year marks the 80th anniversaries of VE Day (Victory in Europe Day) and VJ Day (Victory over Japan Day). Victory over Japan Day is the day on which Imperial Japan



surrendered in World War II, in effect bringing the war to an end. It is an opportunity for the nation to come together and pay tribute to the Second World War generation from across the UK and Commonwealth, through a series of national and local events and activities encouraged by the government.

By the summer of 1945 the world had been gripped by war for six long years. In May, a light had emerged at the end of the tunnel, the end of the war in Europe. Following Germany's surrender, the Allies were striving for victory in the Pacific.

It would take several more months of fighting and the loss of tens of thousands of lives, military and civilian, and the use of two atomic weapons, on Hiroshima and Nagasaki, to compel Japan to surrender on 15 August. Two weeks later, on 2 September, Japan's formal surrender was taken onboard the American battleship USS Missouri in Tokyo Bay.

Over 542,000 Commonwealth servicemen and women had died since the beginning of the war and the Japanese surrender.

Both St Andrew's Church, Much Hadham and St Michael's Church, Bishop's Stortford will ring out in celebration between 6.30pm until 7pm.

Parcel Delivery Scams

I got a text asking me to click on a link to reschedule a parcel delivery I'd missed. I was waiting for a parcel from Royal Mail at the time, so I clicked on the link and was asked to make a payment. Luckily, my daughter told me the text is a scam and to ignore it, but I almost gave away my personal details. How can I spot the signs of this type of scam for myself in the future?

Parcel delivery scams are becoming increasingly common. Ones involving texts and emails are known as phishing scams, and aim to trick you into giving away your personal information and financial details, so your bank account and money can be accessed.

One way scammers do this is by enticing people to click on links, which can lead to fake websites, in the hope that this information will be entered.

While scammers can pretend to be from any parcel delivery company, many of them choose Royal Mail because it's the largest delivery company in the UK. This means the chances of scammers contacting someone who receives parcels from Royal Mail, is higher.

These scams can be in the form of a text, like yours was, or an email or phone call. There are also reports of fake 'Something for You' cards, which Royal Mail leave when a delivery is attempted, but no-one is home. Here are some tips on how you can stay vigilant and spot the signs of a parcel delivery scam, and other scam messages:

- If you're waiting for a parcel, and get a message that asks you to pay to get it, or reschedule the delivery, it's usually a scam.
- Don't click any links or attachments in the text or email. Delivery companies won't ask you to pay them through a link in an email or text.
- Parcel delivery scammers often pretend to be from an organisation like Royal Mail, and can try to make you click on a fake version of the company's genuine website, which asks for personal information or login details - these can appear real.
- To check if a link is genuine, hover your mouse over the link without clicking on it, or press and hold on the link on a mobile device. You should be able to see the address the link goes to, and check it's the same as the company's official website address.
- Make sure you check the address carefully - fake link addresses can look similar to the genuine address.
- Other signs of a message that is a scam include bad spelling and grammar, and when it

starts with a general greeting instead of your name. But, scam messages can sometimes be sophisticated - so don't rely on obvious mistakes only.

- If you get an email, check if the email address matches the sender's name or organisation you might have to click on their name to see the email address.
- If there's something you're unsure about, don't feel pressured to act. You can find the official details for the company the person who has contacted you says they're from, and ask the company if they've contacted you.

Royal Mail has a helpful page on its website of examples of delivery scams, including text messages and emails people have received.

You can check if you think something you've seen online, or in a text or email you've received, might be a scam, using an online tool on the Citizens Advice website. If you have been scammed, you can report it on the Citizens Advice website, and check what else you need to do - including protecting yourself from further risks.

Being targeted by a scammer or falling victim to a scam can make people feel anxious or embarrassed, but it's important to remember scammers are clever and scams can happen to anyone. The Hundred Parishes Society

Before the "dissolution of the monasteries", instigated in 1536 by King Henry VIII, the Hundred Parishes area had its fair share of religious houses – monasteries, convents, abbeys and priories. The remains of some can still be seen today.

Tilty Abbey is one. It was founded for Cistercian monks in 1153 and prospered mainly due to the wool trade before being dissolved. In 1220 a chapel was built outside the abbey gates for use by visitors. The chapel survives and today functions as Tilty's parish church. Little remains of the other abbey buildings but the site can be visited; interpretation boards inform the visitor and give an artist's impression of what the site would have looked like.

Little Dunmow Priory was founded in 1104 and was home to Augustinian monks until the Dissolution. Most of the priory church was demolished but the southern aisle survived. It is now used as the parish church.

Several of our larger hospitality venues were developed on sites of former religious houses: Hanbury Manor in Thundridge was once Poles Convent, Down Hall in Hatfield Heath evolved from a 14th-century monastery, while Leez Priory in Felsted became the home of Richard Rich through his leading role in dissolving the monasteries.

In Saffron Walden, Audley End House was built on the site of Walden Abbey,

the 12th century and whose lands were granted in 1538 to Sir Thomas Audley, Henry VIII's Lord Chancellor. The present house was built some 60 years later by his grandson Thomas Howard.

While we tend to think of religious houses as a bygone era, Pleshey has one that is relatively new and active: its House of Retreat was founded as a convent in the early 1900s and became the first Diocesan Retreat House in England in 1927.
