#### **Father Simon Our Assistant Area Dean writes:**



It's that time of the vear again: that moment, in the face of a brand-new vear, when we try to reset ourselves. And the way many of us do that is by setting New Year resolutions.

I must admit: I rarely set myself one. After all these years, I've learned the hard way that I rarely stick to them beyond the third week of January.



There was that time at school when I promised myself that I'd be far

more diligent in my piano practice. There was that naïve moment in the early days of January when a friend and I took out a subscription to the company gym. By April, neither of us had been more than four times, and it wasn't for another two years before we finally summoned up the courage to face the receptionist together and cancel the monthly deduction from our salaries!

So, like so many other, I've begun diets, productivity initiatives, and made commitments to keep in contact with family and friends better in January. But each time, things have soon fallen by the wayside.



So - no - I don't really do New Year resolutions these days. Instead, I have a New Day resolution which frequently causes a

melody to float past in the back of my mind. It's from one of Jerome Kern's songs 'Pick Yourself

Up', made famous by Fred Astaire and Ginger Rogers in their 1936 movie 'Swing Time'. The line, which goes frequently through my head, is "Pick yourself up, dust yourself off, start all over again". And by committing to this every day, and by getting



up each day with that goal waiting to be achieved, I hope and pray that there may at least be the occasional day in 2025 when I'll succeed in my resolution.



#### Winter care for house plants:-

For many house plants the decreasing light levels in late autumn are a cue to enter a dormant phase in preparation for making it through a potentially tough winter ahead. It is important to allow your plants to rest over winter. If you continue to water and feed them, this will encourage them to keep on growing, putting them under strain and leading to weak, spindly growth. However, if you follow the following tips for winter care, you will have healthy house plants that will be raring to go in the spring.

 Reduce watering - for most house plants, reduce watering to once a fortnight. For succulents, only water every 2-3 weeks, and for cacti, stop watering completely. The exception is winter flowering plants, such as Christmas cacti and poinsettias,


- which need watering whenever the compost feels dry.
- Move into the light it is important to maximise the amount of light reaching your plants. Move them on to a west or south facing windowsill.
- Clean their leaves indoor plants
  often accumulate a thick layer of
  dust on their leaves. This reduces
  the amount of light that can reach
  the leaf surface, making it harder for
  them to manufacture food. Wipe off
  dust regularly using a damp cloth.
- 4. Keep them warm most house plants need a temperature of 12-18 degrees C. They dislike large temperature fluctuations, so position them away from cold draughts and open windows and doors. If they are on a windowsill, leave the curtains open at night if you can, as they trap cold air at night. Alternatively move plants off the windowsill at night.
- 5. Check for pests a nice cosy house provides the perfect environment for many plant pests to thrive and breed over winter. Inspect all your plants thoroughly for pests now, and keep inspecting regularly throughout the winter.





## **History of the Millennium Wood**

Thank you Jono and Wendy for all of your involvement in the care of Millennium Wood. Without your knowledge and time it would have been lost.

Over the years our village community has changed and the history of the wood probably unknown.

In the late 1990's the then Parish Council asked for help towards celebrating the new century. A few residents agreed to arrange some celebrations and residents asked what they may like to do. Creating a nature reserve was mentioned? A number of fundraising events were organised and a letter sent to Glaxo, who still had property in the village. We were informed that they were creating a 3 acre wood, designed by Dale Holt, an employee. The woodland to be for the use of Little Hadham residents. The 'Millennium Wood' was officially opened in April. 2000. A number of residents and Little Hadham and Albury School children planted the last trees. At the entrance into the wood on Millfield Lane a noticeboard was erected and a 'Time Box' buried with a history of the wood, plus memorabilia of the community.

Then Glaxo moved to Ware, selling their land. Glaxo were prepared to donate the Wood to the Parish, but the then Parish Council felt they could not afford to take on the responsibility of the expense of employing someone to maintain the Wood.

Jono and Wendy moved into
Little Hadham, visited the Wood
and became devoted to return
it to a woodland status. Both of
them have worked so hard within
the wood and organising fund
raising events. To have been able
to find people to take over the
responsibility of The Millennium
Wood is a great achievement.

Very many thanks to Jono, Wendy, Dale and all who have supported The Wood and every best wish and thanks to Rachel and Jon for jointly taking over the responsibility.

The wonderful Village Sign, opposite The Nag Pub, was also a Millennium Gift, from the Little Hadham Women's Institute. It was designed and created by Brian Burton. He and his family lived in Albury Road and he taught at Hadham Hall School.

#### St Cecilia's Church Bells

January has always been the month to spring clean and look at things with a new perspective. With this in mind this is what it means in bell towers all over the UK.

General maintenance involves sweeping up in bell towers, both on the ringing floor and up where the bells are. We look out for clusterflies, ladybirds and mouse, bird and bat faeces.

All the ropes need to be checked for damage along their whole length so not only where the ringer handles it but where it goes through the floor of the bell chamber - this is called the garter hole and sometimes the rope is protected by a leather sleeve which can move. The ropes are made of various materials - flax or hemp with a terralene top and the length of the rope expands and contracts by as much as 6" / 12 cm, depending on the weather. So the ropes have to be adjusted with the seasons so the ringers can reach the rope (when we have to stand on wooden boxes to extend our reach) or not have too much rope (when we have to put knots in to shorten it otherwise it becomes dangerous).

There are approximately 100 nuts and bolts to check in the bell tower and the metal components, such as the dingler and runner boards, need to be greased (minimally as grease attracts the dirt). The clappers in the bell need to be checked as they should only swing back and forth and not any other direction.

The wooden components need to be checked for damage and wear and tear. The wooden 'stays' which stop the bell from turning all the way over are made of ash which is a strong and brittle wood so it can withstand a bit of bumping but can break. There are different styles of stay - the majority in Little Hadham are called Hastings stays, a pyramid shaped batton, and our others are Taylor stays.

All this work is recommended to be completed quarterly and takes approximately 3 hours, it is often carried out by bell ringers. Additionally the church Architect checks may also flag up work that needs to be rectified in the bell tower. Often this is structural, expensive work.

Penned on the 17th December, I sit in our house with all furniture in storage and just a couple of teacups and 2 wicker chairs. Today, we move from Little Hadham after 17 wonderful years.

We will eventually be moving to Norfolk, a small village between Diss and Norwich but that will not be until mid January. In the meantime we are staying with a friend in Bishop's Stortford.

With all the packing and preparation going on I haven't had too much time for wanders. However, a really successful trip to Abberton reservior gave great views of Great Northern diver, Black necked grebe, Goosanders and Great white egrets.

A wander around Rye Meads Reserve just after one of the recent storms showed that the birds had left rather than arrived and only a Green sandpiper was of note.

Over the years we have been in Chapel Lane I have run a moth trap most nights in the garden and frequently placed a portable trap in local woods. My species total for the parish is 869, roughly 50% of all moth species for the county. A good record with several being new for county records as well as 3 species that had been declared extinct in 2006.

I am in the process of listing all my nature findings, including 105 bird species for the parish. Once complete I shall forwadrd it to the local archivist for safe keeping and trust it proves an interesting document for future naturalists.

Finally, we shall be returning on occasions to visit friends and it is likely that I shall pop into Millennium Wood for a quick wander down memory lane.





















# The Hundred Parishes Society

This article was drafted by a member of The Hundred Parishes Society who has allowed us to adapt and publish it.

Like others, I have covered many miles through the patchwork of landscape in the Hundred Parishes and have often crossed intersecting footpaths, stopping to examine my map to understand why they exist and where they go.

Recently, I picked up local author Christopher Hadley's book, The Road, in which Hadley explores a spur of Ermine Street which connects former Roman towns at Braughing and Chesterford, carving a straight line for 13 miles through The Hundred Parishes. Hadley draws on years of archaeological and historical research. Tracing the route, he gathers lost names, locates burial mounds and tracks down archaeology in the hope of revealing two thousand years of history. Through his words, we gain a glimpse of the civilisation that sited and constructed the road, of the people who used and maintained it and, eventually, of what happens





when a road passes out of general

use and the legacy it leaves behind.

Much of this route can be walked still; the actual Roman road is most visible as Beards Lane where it defines straight parish boundaries, with Clavering and Arkesden to the south-east and Langley and Elmdon to the north-west.


In short, The Road is a lyrical, nostalgic, sometimes humorous and intriguing social history and travelogue which will enthral enthusiasts of cultural and local history. After finishing this book, I find myself re-examining parish churches, wondering if the red, small bricks in the tower are Tudor in origin or perhaps pillaged from a lost Roman storehouse.

The highway which is the focus of this book is one of several local routes with Roman origins. Many feature somewhere in the walks that can be downloaded from www.hundredparishes.org.uk.
