When you come into the Church, the Altar is covered with cloth, both on top, which is white and on the front which is coloured. The front cloth, called an Altar Frontal is changed depending on which Liturgical season we are in.

Purple: Penance & Preparation - Advent & Lent

White: Purity - Christmas & Easter

Red: Sacrifice - Palm Sunday -Pentecost - martyr's days

Green: Hope - ordinary time

Gold: Joy & Celebration-Easter Sunday & Christmas Day

At St. Cecilia's we have 4 Altar Frontals as our White and Gold fronts are combined.

Our purple frontal was in a very sorry state and about to fall apart.

We have been very lucky that Gilly Bhatt offered to restore it. She painstakingly took it apart, sourced some replacement fabric and then hand-stitched all back together, in time for Advent.

The result is amazing. (as you can see from the before and after photos).

Your next chance to see this is in Lent 18th February—2nd April.

Do go and have a look.

LITTLE HADHAM PARISH COUNCIL – JOIN VIA ZOOM

AN UPDATE ON HIGHWAYS ISSUES IN THE VILLAGE

- Ringway's Street Lighting Contracts Manager has confirmed that the street lighting assets on Standon Road, reported under fault reporting reference 4901004481044, were fixed last Wednesday. This fault highlighted a discrepancy between the reference numbers marked on the street lighting assets and those recorded in the inventory.
- Albury Road** - The road closure on 20 – 24 October was implemented to repair a link box. HCC does not have forward visibility of emergency works, the decision to close the road would therefore have been made by UK Power Networks and its subcontractors. To make a complaint, please contact

- Bus Stop at the Smithy** - Out of a total of 40 people consulted, 90% (36) support the proposal, 5% (2) oppose the proposal and 5% (2) are not sure. This is a suitable mandate for relocating the northbound bus stop from Hadham Ford Road to The Ford (west of The Smithy) and constructing a new section of footway to the relocated bus stop. To avoid the costly lowering of a telecommunications chamber, it is proposed to construct the new footway on a curved alignment rather than parallel to the edge of the carriageway.
- SID on the A120** - to be considered with Phase 3.

This forms part of the scope for phase 3. Paul has received a draft task order from Jacobs setting out the work they will be doing, and what the cost will be. Paul raised some queries and is still awaiting the final version. Paul to chase. No design done yet, task order needs to be in place first.

• Traffic light phasing on the A120

– East / West traffic is currently prioritised, but with Phase 3, North/ South will be the priority. Proposed moving the traffic lights back towards the VH to make the access to and from the lights a single vehicle width. Also taking out the central islands at Albury Road and putting in pedestrian crossings on the A120 (West side) and Albury Road. This may make it less enticing for traffic to use the old A120 as a cut through. The road surface on the junction is in a poor state and needs repairing. It is now being considered for carriageway repair in 26/27. Timescales for phase 3 – awaiting proposal from Jacobs with costings. Design this financial year and implementation in the next year.

- Potholes** - Crossroads on the Ford – this was raised at the PC meeting. The holes are deep enough to see the exposed sensor loop cables for the traffic lights. And has been reported via HCC's Highways fault reporting system. This was assigned the reference number 401004570858. Subsequently received an email informing that 'We have assessed the fault at this location, and it doesn't currently meet our criteria for repair.' It is understood from colleagues in the Asset Management team that this section of The Ash is one of a number of locations being considered for inclusion in the 2026/27 carriageway resurfacing programme.



QUASI'S VISIT TO ELVEDEN CHURCH OF ST ANDREW AND ST PATRICK, FOLLOWED BY A TOUR OF GRIMES GRAVES

One of the enjoyable things about bellringing is discovering the history of other churches and bell towers. In July, ringers from St Michael's, Bishop's Stortford, together with friends and family members visited Elveden Church in Suffolk, which was originally dedicated to St Andrew and has a remarkable history. The Elveden Estate was gifted to Maharaja Duleep Singh in the 1860s as a peace making attempt. The prince and his family had been significant members of London Society and were admitted to the Royal Court by Queen Victoria. He is buried in the churchyard together with his wife and one of his children. The graves are frequently visited by members of the Sikh community.

The bells are installed in a tower detached from, but next to the church; a Memorial Tower built by a later owner of the estate, Lord Iveagh of the Irish Guinness family. The tower is connected to the church by a covered cloister. The church was extended by Lord Iveagh, and the new section dedicated to St Patrick. Our ringers spent a pleasant morning ringing the 8 bells in the tower and exploring the church before heading off to Grimes Graves, a neolithic flint mine near to Thetford in Norfolk. An unlikely

destination for bellringers perhaps but the ringers wanted to see the rebuilt mine entrance building which had just won a design award for the work completed by local building contractor Hutton Construction Ltd, one of the sponsors of the recent restoration project for the bells at St Michael's Bishop's Stortford. We descended the newly installed ladders into the pit where projections onto the walls added to the experience, illustrating the development of the 5,000 year old mine workings. Despite the rain, we had a great day out.

FESTIVE FUN AND FOREST CREATIVITY AT WOODLAND RANGERS

December was a month bursting with festive cheer and hands-on creativity at Woodland Rangers, where children embraced the magic of the season through nature-inspired crafts and outdoor adventures. Using materials gathered straight from the forest floor, the groups created an array of Christmas treasures, from pinecone Christmas trees to beautifully decorated natural baubles. Sticks collected during woodland walks were transformed into jingling bell sticks, adding music to the winter air.

The Home Education group took their skills to the next level, confidently using knives for whittling to craft charming wooden Christmas gnomes. They also put their drilling and sawing experience to good use, building delightful wooden reindeer to take home.

With colder weather making fire-lighting more challenging, the children learned to make their own natural firelighters using pinecones, kindling, string, and melted wax. Their excitement at seeing how well they worked was a highlight of the session.

Younger children enjoyed mixing seeds and oats to create special reindeer food for Santa's visit. This activity also opened a conversation about the deer that roam the woodland, sparking enthusiasm as the children dashed

around spotting moss, leaves, and berries - favourite snacks for local wildlife.

In the final week of term, Woodland Rangers were delighted to lead a Golden Morning session at Little Hadham Primary School, where pupils crafted wooden Christmas tree sculptures using real tools.

The term ended with gingerbread icing, campfire hot chocolate, and, for the older children, the ever-popular S'mores. Woodland Rangers thank the Little Hadham community for their support throughout 2025 and look forward to welcoming new families in 2026.

Citizens Advice East Herts is on a mission to rebuild and expand our face-to-face advice service, which has been significantly reduced since the pandemic. We know that our phone and email service suits many of our clients, particularly those who can't get into towns during the working day or people in rural locations with poor transport. However, we also know, because you tell us, that many of you miss the face-to-face interaction with an adviser, and for some this is an essential service for many different reasons, such as a hearing impairment, or a language barrier.

So, since May we have doubled the opening hours of our outreach sessions at the Methodist Church in Bishop's Stortford, open on Tuesdays from 10 to 2pm, and in September we opened a new outreach at Hertford Library on Wednesdays from 10 am to 2 pm. We have also extended our hours at Ware Priory, on Tuesdays from 10 to 1pm and at the Manor House, Buntingford on Mondays from 10 to 12.30.

All this means that we need more trained volunteers to guide people through online information and deliver advice in these outreaches. If you're passionate about making a difference in your community, are

looking for a challenging and fulfilling volunteer role, and can offer us a day a week, please do consider lending your time and skills to support this work. Volunteering with us can bring huge benefits to you too, gaining skills and confidence, as well as joining our friendly team.

We have spaces available on our adviser training programme starting January 14th at the Manor House in Buntingford. You don't need any previous experience, just an appetite for learning and competent IT skills. You'll attend classroom sessions in Buntingford, one day a week, for 12 weeks, followed by shadowing experienced advisers until you are ready to go solo advising clients on the phone or in person.

Trainees will learn how to advise clients on housing, employment, benefits, consumer issues, debt and more.

One of the pleasures of taking a stroll round any of the towns and villages within the Hundred Parishes is enjoying the variety of gardens which enhance the settings of homes. They are thriving testaments to those within these communities whose horticultural skills add to the local sense of pride.

Last October the RHS published its State of Gardening Report which highlighted the many reasons why gardens are so important. Within the UK they cover almost a million hectares, more than three times the area of National Nature Reserves. Many local gardens include a variety of trees as well as an increasing range of flowering plants, some from other parts of the world so that the flowering season is extended. This provides not just winter and spring colour but also pollen and nectar for any pollinating insects that are active at that time. Well-vegetated gardens are havens for other forms of wildlife too including hedgehogs and many common birds, especially if supplementary food and nesting sites are provided.

Last spring the Essex Wildlife Trust asked residents to complete records of house sparrows visiting their gardens as these once common birds are now in serious decline. The reasons for the decline of urban populations include the reduction of invertebrate food such as caterpillars, which are essential for rearing nestlings, and a shortage of suitable nesting sites in modern houses. 501 gardens were surveyed and the information gathered suggested that older properties were more likely to provide nesting sites for these birds who also favoured gardens

with a pond. By growing a wide variety of flowering plants and installing clusters of nest boxes in your garden you may be able to provide a suitable habitat for encouraging house sparrows to thrive. For information about the project see www.essexwt.org.uk/house-sparrow-project

Happy new year greetings from the Gardens! Before Christmas we had some mild, soggy days of work at the Gardens – unbelievably the wildflower spiral and the roses in the walled kitchen garden were still flowering! 
