### Highways Update Speed and Traffic Surveys

SID - A meeting is scheduled to discuss the best location for the Speed Indicator Device on the A120. One suggestion is near the school. The feasibility of installing a speed camera on the hill down towards the traffic lights at the Ash is being looked into.

Potholes in Chapel Lane and at the crossroads on the Ford – this was raised at the PC meeting. The holes are deep enough to see the cables for the traffic lights.

We have 8 volunteers for the Neighbourhood Plan and have a startup meeting organised to discuss the way forward. There are still opportunities to contribute. The time commitment would be to give at least 4-6 hours a month of their time (potentially more some months and less in others). Anyone with planning experience would be particularly welcome!

### **Parish Assembly**

There is little interest from the village. So far, I have been unable to get a commitment from the various groups in the village to present their progress over the last year or set up a stall to show what they can offer. Therefore, the Parish Assembly will be a short meeting before the Parish Council meeting on the 6th May. Shame there is not more interest in our village. The

usual turnout for the Parish Council meetings is generally 10-18 people from the village. When there is an issue that affects the village, we see over 40. If there was no longer a Parish Council, we would have no voice in what happens in our village.

#### **Plant Sale**

Our annual Plant Sale and Coffee Morning is on 10th May, so when tidying your gardens and dividing perennials this year, please pot up some extra plants for sale and bring them along to Little Hadham Village Hall before 9.30am. This is an important fund raiser for the club so please support us.

### **Growing edible flowers**

Many vegetables and herbs, including chives, courgettes, mint and runner beans have edible flowers. You can then use them in salads and to flavour and decorate drinks, while some are large enough to stuff with cheese and fry.

It's worth noting that the flowers of some plants, such as narcissus and foxgloves are toxic, so unless you know the flowers are edible, don't eat it.

Nutritional benefits – many edible flowers are high in vitamins A and C, which promote a healthy immune system, and are rich in beneficial antioxidants.



**How to sow** – Most edible flowers, including chamomile, chives, cornflowers, courgettes and marigolds can be grown from seed. Sow them in the ground or in a pot on their own or with other flowers or veg in a sunny spot.

**How to grow** – Bergamot, lavender and pinks are easy to grow from plug plants or young plants. Roses and scented pelargoniums are best bought as plants.

Harvesting - Pick flowers regularly to encourage more blooms, harvesting them on a dry morning for the best flavour. With courgettes, pick the male flowers only, to avoid reducing your vegetable harvest. These grow on a long, thin stalk, rather than an

immature courgette. Eat only the petals and avoid eating any blooms that may have been sprayed with pesticide.

**Storing** - once they have been harvested, use edible flowers immediately or store in the fridge for a couple of days in a plastic bag. Crystallised flowers will keep in an airtight container for several months.

Bergamot (Monarda) – have a mild sweet flavour and can be used to flavour teas and add as a garnish to salads.

Courgette – the flowers are considered a delicacy in some circles. Remove the stamens and dip them in a light batter and deep fry, or for a more decadent dish, fill them with cream cheese first, gently twisting the end of the flower over to hold the cheese in place.

**Cornflower**- have a sweet, spicy, almost clove-like flavour and can be used to make an attractive salad garnish.

**Chamomile**- have a warm, apple-like flavour and should be used fresh or dried, in teas.

Rose – have a wonderful fresh flavour. Use them fresh or crystallised on cakes, or gently simmer the petals in water to make your own rosewater.

**Chives** – have a spicy, oniony flavour and can be used to add a kick to salads and soups.



**Primrose** – crystallise the petals and use them as a pretty decoration on cakes.

**Lavender** – can be overpowering, so use sparingly in cakes, biscuits and lemonade.

**Viola** – have a sweet, mildly spicy flavour. Crystallise the flowers whole for cakes, or sprinkle the petals on salads.

**Pinks (Dianthus)** – have a spicy, clove-like taste. Use them to perk up salads.



# The Hundred Parishes Society

A barn is essential for a working farm, to store produce, tools and machinery and to house livestock. The Hundred Parishes has many fine examples of ancient barns which are still in use today, albeit sometimes for a purpose not envisaged when they were built. Some have been converted into homes while others have quite varied new uses.

In 1994, Thorley church purchased a dilapidated 16th-century barn which, following restoration, opened for community use as St Barnabas Centre. At Duddenhoe End, the thatched Hamlet Church started life as a barn.

Ashdon and Westmill village halls both began life as barns in the 17th century.

Great Bardfield and Great Saling each have an ancient barn that has been converted into a retail outlet with café, respectively The Blue Egg and Timbers.

In Chrishall, the Red Cow pub offers accommodation in the adjacent 500-year-old thatched barn.

In Little Easton, the Countess of Warwick converted one of her barns into the Barn Theatre. It was used by many famous performers of the early 1900s and still occasionally serves that purpose, on other days being part of a tea room and events venue called Little Easton Manor. In Great Bardfield, a Grade-I listed, 16th-century brick barn at Great



Lodge now serves as the Anne of Cleves Barn wedding venue.

In Widdington, Grade I-listed Priors Hall Barn is a fine example of a medieval barn, dating from the 14th century and now owned by English Heritage. It is said that 400 oak trees were used in its construction. The large doors on either side could be opened for threshing, with the draught blowing the husks away from the grain. Priors Hall Barn is free to visit, open at weekends from April to September.

May is a lovely month at the Gardens, with flowers everywhere: alliums, foxgloves, irises, roses, to name a few. The Italian Garden beds will be lined with helianthemum. The herb border in the Walled Kitchen Garden will be in flower. There will still be blossom - deep pink hawthorn in the Glade; and the purple of the rhododendrons in the Japanese garden. And there

will be wildflowers too...the last of the bluebells at the beginning of the month, followed by orchids and of course the wafting cow parsley in Laburnum Walk.

Marking the end of the Second World War in Europe, 8 May 1945 was a hugely significant day for the airmen and women at Easton Lodge, as elsewhere. Our history of the airfield will be on display, with photos and stories of those involved. On Thursdays, visitors can chat to our volunteer gardeners and buy our seasonal produce.



Our 18 May Sunday Open Day will focus on Easton Lodge's Tudor history. Queen Elizabeth I granted the estate at Little Easton to Henry Maynard in 1590 and he owned a lot of other land in the local neighbourhood too. Our Archivists will present a special display and there will be a range of fun activities for children, including archery for the older/stronger ones, provided by White Dragon archery and making cordage bangles, with Discover Bushcraft. Colchester Waits will play Tudor music on shawms, bagpipes. fiddles and recorders. There will be Tudor foods to sample and a range of stalls. 



### In these days of everything digital, how can I talk to someone in person at Citizens Advice East Herts about my problem?

You can come to our Contact Centre at the Manor House in Buntingford open every Monday from 10am to 12pm.

#### What is the Contact Centre for?

While most people can contact us by calling our message line on 01920 459 944 or sending an email, we know that some people may not have internet access or be confident on the phone. The Contact Centres are for anyone who needs a bit of extra help to get the advice they need.

#### How do they work?

It's a bit like a triage service at a hospital where you are assessed to see if you need a doctor or a nurse. We'll listen to you, so we can work out what help you need. We can talk you through the options for this, set you up on our system, arrange for an adviser to call you back for an advice session, arrange a face to face appointment or point you in the right direction for any additional help.

### Can you give full advice at these sessions?

There isn't always time to give full advice, which could take 20-40 minutes and you might need to bring extra paper work or documents. If it's not too busy, we will do what we can to help you move forward with your problem, but we wouldn't have time,

for instance, to help with applying for benefits, so we would need to make an appointment for this.

#### What if I want face to face advice?

We can arrange that, if it's the best way to help you. We can see you at the Manor House, or another venue in East Herts such as Bishop's Stortford Library.

### What kinds of issues do people come to you with?

In the last year, we've seen 99 people at the Manor House, with a massive range of issues including problem debt, housing problems, child access issues, consumer issues and scams. No problem is too big or too small – if we can't help, we will find someone who can.

### What should I do if I have an urgent problem?

Our Message Line on 01920 459 944 is always the fastest way to get in touch. We try to get back to messages within 24 hours, although we are closed at weekends. If you miss our call back, our advisers will try two more times to get in touch, we really want to make sure you get the help you need. During opening hours (10am to 4pm) the Message Line has an option to speak with an adviser straight away if you prefer.

Or you can visit our website: **citizensadviceeastherts.org. uk** where you can find lots of useful links to information that might help with your problem.
